

Can I get into Speech-Language Pathology graduate programs with a Cog Sci major?

The answer is a qualified “Yes.” Speech-language pathology programs typically have requirements in fields such as biology, psychology, and statistics, which you can easily fulfill at Lehigh. They typically also have some more specialized requirements in communication sciences that are not likely to be available at Lehigh. However, you can make these up by taking some classes elsewhere, including on-line. Some programs also allow them to be taken concurrently with the master’s degree work.

What are the requirements for these programs?

You can get some general information from [ASHA, the American Speech-Language-Hearing Association](#). Also check websites of individual programs, such as at [Lasalle](#). Most will have similar requirements. There is a link to search for SLP programs within the ASHA site.

Where would I find on-line classes to fill in what Lehigh doesn’t offer?
